

Department of Homeland Security Relaxes Standards for Verifying Work Authorization

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Homeland Security has relaxed its standards requiring in-person review of work authorization documents required to complete the I-9 form.

Specifically, if an employer has no employees physically present at a work location to be able to perform in-person review of documents, the employer is now permitted to review work authorization documents remotely in order to complete an I-9 form within three days of a new hire. Employers doing so, however, must provide written documentation of their remote onboarding and telework policy to each employee being hired.

If an employer continues to have any employees working physically on site, the relaxed standard is not available to that employer. Once normal operations resume, all employees who were onboarded using remote verification must receive in-person verification of identity and employment eligibility within three business days to remain in compliance with the I-9 requirements.
